# *Impact of Presidential Executive Orders On Town Services*



## *Housing Choice Option Program* (f/k/a Section 8)

- 121 dwelling units (183 participants, 43 children)
- 2025 Budget: \$1.2 million in Federal payments
- Temporarily paused and later resumed but subject to further review and possible cuts

## *US Dept. of Energy Efficiency Grants*

- Grant of \$74,000 to replace two boilers at Town Hall
- DOE's January 27 paused all grants pending review of possible Diversity Equity & Inclusion activities

## *Federal funding of road improvement contracts*

- Carman Rd/Lydius St roundabout: Federal Highway Safety Program
- Sidewalks on State highways

# *Our Welcoming Community*

## **Pro-Housing Community**

- Town Board resolution in support of affordable and work force housing options
- Only Town in area to receive certification
- State certification should help in securing financing for proposed applications offering affordable housing

## **Pride Flag**

- Town Board resolution approving flying the Pride flag at Town Hall in support of the LGBTQ+ community

# ***SOLID TOWN FINANCES***

## ***2025 BUDGET***

- Under tax cap by \$3,285; 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive year below the State's property tax cap
- Includes 3% increases in salaries
- Added \$356,000 in reserves
- Unassigned Fund Balance is 29% of 2025 Budget's appropriations
- Capital investments in Police, Parks, EMS and more departments
- Most property taxes go somewhere else: 68% (School Districts); 13% (Albany County); 4% (Fire Districts); 4% (Library); **and only 11% for the Town of Guilderland**


# TRANSPARENCY

## *Continuing Website Enhancements*

- Posting of agenda packets, budget materials, and collective bargaining agreements
- Digitized recordings posted within 48 hours
- Added community partners' events (Community Caregivers, Fire Departments, Library, Guilderland Historical Society, Guilderland Garden Club, YMCA)
- Expanded GIS Property Information

- Expanded public notice by extending dates and first class mailings
- Town Clerk: 212 FOIL requests (190 in 2023)



# ***SUPPORT FOR SENIORS***

## **Expanding coverage**

- Serving 800+ Town seniors (60+) served
- 3,000+ transportations for shopping, medical, and meals
- 2024: Added Village of Altamont residents

## **Senior Citizen Property Tax Exemption**

- Increased exemption from \$37,400 to **\$58,400**
- **456 seniors** (increase from 275 in 2023)

## **Programs**

- Recreation (bingo, mahjongg, pinochle)
- Exercise and nutritional programs
- Painting and quilting

## **Services**

- Income tax and legal referrals
- Monthly newsletter
- Help applying for government assistance
- Home maintenance referrals
- Assistance finding appropriate housing

# ***EMS: LEADER IN ALS RESPONSE***

## ***2025 BUDGET***

- Added paramedic and EMT positions
- Now 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> ambulances at peak times
- New ambulance (\$350,000+; one-year plus lead time)
- Added to reserve for future ambulances

## ***CONTINUED HIGH DEMAND IN 2024***

- 6,727 calls; setting another yearly record
- 4,227 hospital transports (3,807 in 2023)
- Advanced Life Support: intravenous therapy; tracheal intubation; administer Rx; electrocardiography

## ***STATE & REGIONAL REOGNITIONS***

- State EMS Agency of the Year (2021)
- Regional ALS Provider of the Year (2024) (Harjup Singh)

## ***LEADER IN EMS INITIATIVES***

- Hospital off-load policy (prolonged ambulance delays)
- Direct pay legislation (insurance payments)



# ***STAYING AHEAD OF THE COMMUNITY'S NEEDS***



**New EMS Substation**

## **EMS STATION III**

- **Opened on October 14, 2024**
- **506 calls in 2024**
- **Maintain superior ALS response times (6-8 minutes)**
- **First ambulance station in 40 years; no financing**
- **New home for Town's Emergency Command Vehicle**
- **At Western Turnpike Golf Course with direct access to Routes 20 & 146**

# ***SUPPORT FOR FIREFIGHTERS***



**New Fire Training Facility**

## ***Fire Training Facility***

- Ribbon cutting (October 22, 2024)
- Replace 50-year old facility
- \$500,000 County grant
- Partnering with Town's fire departments
- Essential training for volunteer firefighters

## ***Town Property Tax Exemption***

- Maximum benefit for Town-resident active firefighters (114 exemptions)
- 2025: Extending benefit to Town residents who are firefighters in neighboring towns

# *JUSTICE COURT*



## **2024 COURT STATISTICS**

Traffic Violations	5,807 (4,772 in 2023)
Penal Law	823 cases (same)
Civil Cases	138 cases (127)

## **DEPT. OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE GRANTS**

- **Enhanced security (2023)**
  - Metal detector; door fobs
- **Court improvements (2024)**
  - Carpet; shredder
- **Furniture (2025)**
  - Conference table & chairs in chambers
  - Courtroom chairs

# ***PUBLIC SAFETY INITIATIVES***

## ***Expanded Police Force (2025)***

- Added officer; now at 44 uniformed officers; largest in Town history; officers assigned US Drug Enforcement Agency
- **Traffic safety detail:** proven results on Western Avenue
- Resource officers at Farnsworth Middle School & High School

## ***New equipment (2024-25)***

- 2025 Budget: 5 new police vehicles (most ever)
- New body & car cameras, bullet proof vest, tasers

## ***Upgrading dispatch consoles (2024)***

- Essential for 911 responses; maintain local dispatch
- Most modern radio equipment available for emergency communications and interoperability

## ***NYS Law Enforcement Accreditation***

- Accredited since 2009; reaccredited (2024)
- 110 standards of practices & training
- Only 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of police agencies are accredited



# ***PUBLIC SAFETY: NEXT STEPS***

## ***Reduce speed limit to 25mph***

- 2023 law: Town could reduce speed limit on Town roads to 25mph but **required expensive traffic engineer study to justify the lower speed**
- Proposed 2025 law: Town would have the same ability as cities to reduce speed to 25mph; **eliminate need for traffic study**

## ***Use of Speed “Humps” to reduce speed?***

- Success on Elmwood Street (2023)
- Evaluating for Willow Street
- Part of Highway Dept.'s paving schedule

## *Sidewalks (over 50 miles)*

### **New sidewalks (2025)**


- Carman Rd (Western to E. Old State)
- E. Old State (Carman Road to Hillside)

### **New multi-use path (2025)**

- NYS State Route 146 (Western Avenue to Winter Rec Area); part of bridge replacement

### **ADA self-assessment (2024)**

- Evaluated condition of all sidewalks for disabled persons and replacement schedule

# ***PROVEN ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS***

## ***Two Roundabouts: Proven Safe & Successful***

### **Carman Road/Lydius St roundabout (October 2022)**

- 16 accidents (1 with personal injury) in 20 months
- Most accidents on Mondays and Tuesdays
- common cause: failure to yield right of way

### **Northway/Crossgates Mall roundabout (July 2023)**

- 9 accidents (2 with personal injury) in 12 months
- Most accidents on Saturdays
- common cause: following too closely
- No DOT detour signs due to holiday backups

### ***County's Planned Roundabout (2025-26)***

- Route 155 & Washington Avenue intersection
- Adding 300 feet to left turn at Old State Road

# ***HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE***

## ***PAVING***

- 168.5 miles of center lane of Town road
- Surging costs kept paving to less than 6 miles for past two paving seasons
- 30-40 tons a day of blacktop repairs
- In-house paving equipment; save dollars
- Mechanics fabricate parts in-house

## ***KEEPING OUR STREETS CLEANED***

- Fall leaf pick-up schedule on Town roads
- Year round pick-up of lawn bags and tied brush
- Cleaning of stormwater catch basins
- Sweep all Town roads (five times per year)

## ***NEW EQUIPMENT***

- 2025 Budget: Lift for heavy vehicles (\$200,000)

## ***NEW SIDEWALK DUTIES***

- 2025 Budget: 3 new positions for sidewalk maintenance
- 2 Ventrac sidewalk snowplows
- Mini-excavator

# ***INVESTMENTS IN WATER RESOURCES***



**Watervliet Reservoir**

## ***Replacement of Water Meters (2025)***

- \$4.4 million contract award (no financing)
- 13,000+ meters with remote monitoring
- Advance notice of leaks; save 100,000s of gallons
- Starting in Spring 2025

## ***Excessive Summer Water Usage***

- Winter usage (2 to 2.5 million gallons per day)
- Summer usage (5 to 7 million gallons per day)
  - Why? Lawn sprinklers @ wrong times

## ***Improvements at Water Filtration Plant***

- New filters; pre-treatment of Reservoir water
- Added capacity: 0.5 million gallons per day

## ***Possible renewal of Town wells***

- Green sand filtration to remove metals
- Added capacity: 2 million gallons per day

## **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (2025)**

- **8 Special Use applications** (12 in 2023)
- **3 Site Plan Use applications** (3 in 2023)
- **1 Major (5+ lots) subdivision application** (3 in 2023)

## **UPDATES**

- New York Oncology & Hematology (opening early 2026)
- Costco (approved May, 2023; opening late 2025); Albany Pine Bush Comm. stated that land had no preservation or protection value; DEC and USF&W agreed


# ***RESPONSE TO CLIMATE CHANGE***

## ***Preserve 30% of Town's land mass***

- Update Zoning Map by rezoning parks, open space, and protected lands
- Partners: Albany Pine Bush Preserve, Department of Environmental Conservation, Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy, and Open Space Institute

## ***Upper Bozenkill Preserve***

- Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy
- Acquired in 2024
- 225-acres on Bond Road
- 6+ miles of hiking, snowshoeing
- Protects Bozenkill & Watervliet Reservoir

# ***PROTECTING OPEN SPACE***

## ***Conservation Easement Program***


- State law allows Town to grant property tax exemption for voluntarily preserving sensitive area
- Only handful of communities State-wide participate
- First application (2023)
  - ✓ 44 acres preserved (Normans Kill) (see photo)

## ***Native Tree Preservation Law***

- Protect Town's natural environment by preserving native trees and eradicating invasives
- Educational, not punitive
- Committee preparing a Forestry Plan

## ***Conservation Overlay District (2025)***

- New committee formed
- Consider measures to protect Watervliet Reservoir, water courses, views of the Helderberg, and “green belt” around Village of Altamont

## ***Mynderse-Frederick House (1802)***

- Back porch reconstructed
- Shutter removal & repair
- Foundation repair
- Exterior paint
- Interior paint (first floor)
- Replace windows
- Replace rear roof extension

## ***Schoolcraft House (circa 1840)***

- Furnace replaced
- Fix chimney leakage
- Exterior paint
- Replace roof (Fahy, 2025)
- Pave parking lot (Fahy, 2025)


